Palmer High School is the only school in the MSBSD to offer the I.B. Diploma Program to its students.

The I.B. Diploma Program is an internationally-recognized academic program designed to prepare students for wherever their path takes them after high school.

The I.B. Program emphasizes development of students' abilities to think critically and globally, and to develop the soft-skills necessary to be successful anywhere students go: time management, problemsolving, the ability to work in a group, and the ability to work independently.

The I.B. program is available to all juniors and seniors enrolled at PHS. While some courses require pre-requisites, there is no admissions process—students need only to enroll in the course through the guidance office.

Take a class and the I.B. exam!

Signing up for I.B. exams is optional, but we encourage students to do so.

Most colleges now give credit for students' scores on Higher Level I.B. exams, and many give credit for Standard Level exams as well.

Participate the Full I.B. Diploma Program!

To earn the full I.B. Diploma, a student takes one I.B. course from groups 1 through 5, a sixth course of their choosing, and they complete the core of the I.B. program: Theory of Knowledge (a class taken during the school day), an Extended Essay (a college-level research paper completed independently but with instructor guidance and supervision), and CAS: Creativity, Activity and Service, a component where students meet learning objectives in three areas both by working independently and with others.
