
## **Program Description**

Mat-Su Middle College School (MSMCS), a Northwest-Accredited high school, is a partnership between the Matanuska-Susitna Borough School District (MSBSD) and the University of Alaska. The school opened in fall 2011. Our location is on the Mat-Su College campus in Palmer, Alaska. MSMCS is a dual-enrollment program through which college-capable students complete coursework that earns college credits towards a high school diploma and college degree. Application is open to all juniors and seniors residing within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. MSMCS students integrate with regular college students in classes taught by college professors. Enrollment in MSMCS provides students with the opportunity to earn enough college credits to enter a four-year university with sophomore or juniorlevel credit status. Students who work hard and take full advantage of this program can graduate with an Associate degree. MSMCS pays all costs associated with tuition, fees and course-required materials. As members of the college community, MSMCS students can avail themselves of the resources offered by Mat-Su College. They have access to computer labs, campus clubs, theater, library, career counseling, advising and mental health services.

### Community

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough is located in Southcentral Alaska about 35 miles north of Anchorage. The Borough, often referred to as the "Mat-Su Valley," has a total area of 25,258 square miles— an area larger than the state of West Virginia. The population as of 2022 is over 105,000 residents. The area is considered to be Alaska's breadbasket because it is the state's largest agricultural region. The Borough is the fastest growing region of the state, largely based on its proximity to Anchorage; nearly 40 percent of the Borough residents work in Anchorage. Twenty— six percent of the adult population holds a Bachelors degree or higher. The MSBSD serves 18,060 students with 36% on Free or Reduced Lunch.

GPA Calculation – GPAs are calculated on a 4.0 scale. AP, IB courses and 100-level and above college courses (beg. fall 2017) are weighted one additional point. In 2022, a minimum of 23.5 credits were required for graduation, increasing to a minimum of 24.5 in 2023. To mitigate effects of COVID-19, MSBSD (Spring 2020) and the University of Alaska, Anchorage (Spring and Fall 2020) provided students the option of Pass/Fail grading rather than letter grades.
