- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in the classroom

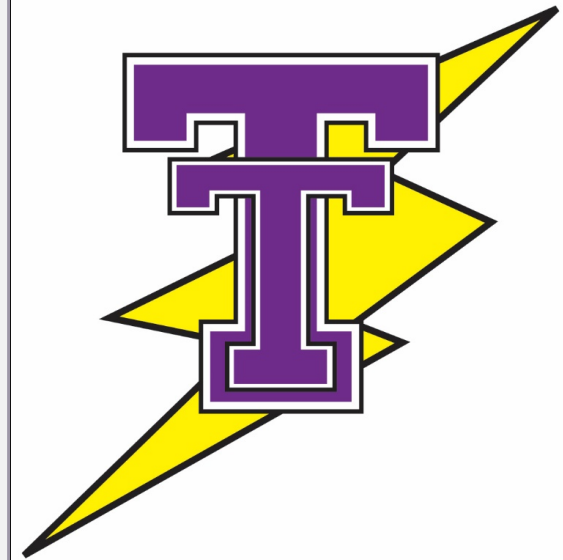
