The American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES) helps students move forward in their educational journeys by providing a wide range of programs and scholarship opportunities. AISES scholarships help students acquire skills and training that will help them meet the unique STEM needs of our communities. We highly encourage you to apply for all the scholarships you are eligible for! To apply, you must be an AISES member.

AISES student members have easy access to scholarships for American Indians, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Indigenous peoples of Canada through the Online Scholarship Application Information System (OASIS) provided by Indigenous Education, Inc. In OASIS, students will complete a General Application Profile that can be finished, revised and submitted year-round and that will automatically match students only with the scholarship opportunities they are eligible for, and those that are open and available to receive. Creating a General Application Profile is the first step to completing other scholarship applications that you qualify for.

Open Scholarships

Advancing Agricultural Science Opportunities for Native Americans (AASONA) Scholarship (2020-2021)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

The AISES Advancing Agricultural Science Opportunities for Native Americans is for students interested in or pursuing agriculture related STEM degrees. Scholarships require participation in a cohort of other Native students in the same field as well as participation in a mentorship program. Scholarships are \$5,000 per student per academic year.

AISES 3M Scholarship 2020-2021

Due Date: March 31, 2020

In partnership with 3M, the American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES) is pleased to announce the 3M Scholarship for incoming college freshman students pursuing ANY STEM degree.

AISES A.T. Anderson Scholarship (2020-2021)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

The A.T. Anderson Memorial Scholarship Program is funded through a variety of sources, including memorials, individual donations, AISES fundraisers, and other corporate grants. Scholarships are \$1,000 for the academic year for undergraduate students and \$2,000 for graduate students.

AISES Aristocrat/VGT Scholarship (2020-2021)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

VGT an Aristocrat Company Scholarships are available to full-time undergraduate and graduate students with a 3.0 GPA or higher in a field related to casino gaming (software development, technology, supply chain, etc.).

AISES Chevron Scholarship (2020-2021)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

Chevron Scholarships are awarded to American Indian, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, First Nations and other indigenous peoples of North America who are students in higher education. Scholarships are for 5,000 per academic year. Continuing scholarships may be awarded but student must re-apply annually.

AISES ExxonMobil Geosciences Summer Fieldwork Scholarship (Summer 2020)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

Scholarships are for \$3,000 and provide direct support to undergraduate, MS and PhD students for geology mapping, geological field based analysis, or geophysical fieldwork and research.

AISES Intel Growing The Legacy Scholarship Program (2020-2021)

Due Date: March 31, 2020

The Intel Growing the Legacy Scholarship Program will support undergraduate and graduate students. This Program includes financial support, mentorship, paid internship opportunities, and, upon successful graduation, employment opportunities with Intel. Scholarships are \$5,000 for undergraduate students and \$10,000 for graduate students.
