Even in Alaska's smallest rural communities, where jobs can often be hard to find, healthcare offers year-round employment opportunities. Whether you hope to work at a hospital in Anchorage or in a clinic Kaktovik, be ready to take the first step toward your career in healthcare with CITC's **Health Profession Opportunity Grants (HPOG) program!** We offer certifications in a variety of healthcare jobs, including: Phlebotomy Technician, Pharmacy Technician, Dental Assistant, Medical Office Assistant, and more.

The HPOG program involves five phases: Eligibility Screening; Application Submission, Intake, Academic Advising/Support and Employment Navigation Support.

General Eligibility Requirements:

- 18 years of age
- U.S. citizen or legal resident
- Alaska Native/American Indian preference
- Verified low income status
- Review of criminal history/background check
- Must reside in Anchorage, Eagle River, or the Mat-Su Valley
