What is Title I?

Title I provides financial assistance to local schools for children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

How are funds used at Meadow Lakes?

- **Parent and Family Engagement Nights** (at least four per year): supplies for projects/games and food for shared meals within our community
- **Increased Instructional Staff:** Four Tutor Advisors support small group and differentiated instruction for all students throughout the school day.
- **Incentives for Academic and Behavioral Progress:** Students are rewarded for positive efforts in making progress with coupons for shopping in the school and classroom stores each week.
- **School and Classroom Supplies:** To ensure all kids and teachers have the tools and equipment they need to be successful in learning.



How is progress monitored?

- Academic Progress is monitored using Aimsweb every two weeks, MAP three times per year, iReady Diagnostic testing annually and PEAKs in the spring (as well as classroom assessments)
- Behavioral Progress is tracked in office referrals and suspension rates.



When can I expect information about my child's progress?

Report	How Often	When
Report Cards	Quarterly	October, January, March, May
MAP/Aimsweb Data	Three times per year	October, January, May
PEAKS (grades 3-5 only)	annually	Test in spring, results in fall

Parents can request more frequent progress updates or conferences with teachers at any time. The best way to set this up is to call or email the teacher directly.

MAP, Aimsweb and PEAKS reports explain proficiency levels on the report that accompanies the results.



Academic Progress

MAP Proficiency Rate (40th percentile and higher)	Reading	Language	Math
Fall 2019	46%	45%	45%
Fall 2020	48%	44%	42%
Fall 2021	50.3%	36.75%	49.3%
